Highlights of the Theta Omicron Board Meeting
Dec 15, 12 Noon, PSB 103C

- ◆ The Spring Membership Meeting was discussed. This event will take place February 28, 2007 at the Snow Goose. There was discussion about other locations, including poster presentations, and the opportunity to earn CEU credits for the poster presentations.
- ◆ Invitations to Inductees will be sent as soon as the fall grades have been received.
- ◆ Orientation of Inductees should be convenient for all 3 groups of students. Board members will participate to answer students' questions.
- ◆ Discussion was held regarding the Graduate Orientation, scheduling is challenge since the two groups are on opposite schedules. Fall was suggested as the better time, since spring is fairly busy.
- ◆ The Excellence Award Committee will start working on the nominations for the 2007 award recipient. There have been calls from outside of Anchorage. There was also discussion about who should be the guest speaker.
- ◆ Theta Omicron will participate in the Women's Run again this year.
- ◆ Discussion was held regarding Sigma Theta Tau presence at the upcoming Evidence Based Practice Conference at the Alaska Native Medical Center. The conference is scheduled for June 25 and 26, 2007. Discussion points included the cost of sponsoring a table, paying for conference break snacks, and enlisting a member staff a table to recruit inactive members or who belong to another chapter and may wish to transfer over to Theta Omicron.
- ◆ Sponsoring Poster Receptions was discussed. Poster topics, suggestions for locations and participatory incentives were offered. For example, provide mini-grants for posters, or create a research award that focuses on nursing student participation.
- ◆ The Research Award guidelines have been revised. These are posted on the website.
- ◆ The Membership Report indicated there are 300 active members.
